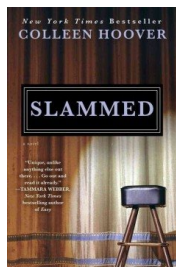


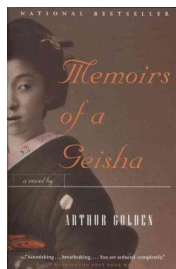

by Colleen Hoover

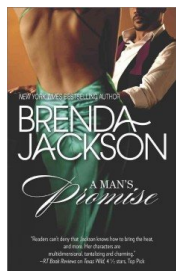

by Arthur Golden

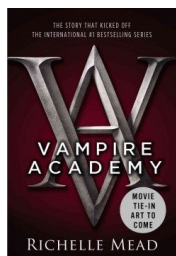

by Brenda Jackson

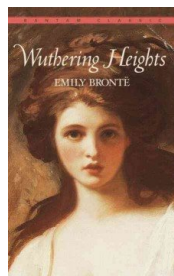

by Richelle Mead

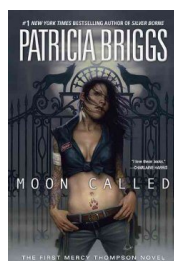

by Patricia Briggs

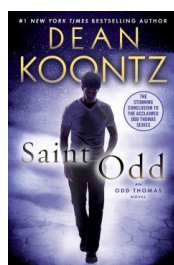
The first book in the popular Mercy Thompson series--wherein the main character must contend with a world of vampires, werewolves and gremlins.
