The search is on for next Library Director

The Bloomington Public Library Board of Trustees has hired the Vernon Hills firm of John Keister and Associates to con-

duct a nationwide search to help hire the next director of Bloomington Public Library.

The firm made two visits to Bloomington in late February to gather information about the Library and insights about the characteristics the board, staff, and community leaders hope to find in the person who will ultimately replace former Director Georgia Bouda, who retired to South Carolina after serving as the Library's director for nine years. Bouda's last day of work was December 4, 2015.

Interim Library Director Terry Lindberg said that Keister took away from this visit that the Library needs "someone who's experienced and politically savvy; someone who is forward-thinking and

recognizes that the future of the library is heavily involved with collaboration, with community involvement, and with technology; and someone who can motivate and lead a very talented and very experienced staff."

Keister and Associates intends to advertise the position through both national and local channels. The firm has also posted an informational website about the search. That website can be located at johnkeister.com/bloomington/ Applicants desiring full consideration should submit to Keister and Associates their cover letter, resume, and three professional references by Wednesday, April 6. By early-to mid-May, the firm expects to be holding final interviews with the board and the selection committee, conducting reference checks, and presenting an offer from the Bloomington Public Library Board of Trustees to the preferred candidate. "The goal is to be thorough and to make sure we bring the right people for final selection. We think it will take a couple of months. We're less concerned about giving ourselves a deadline than we are about getting it done right," Lindberg said.

As part of the 2016 Area Arts Showcase, Bloomington Public Library will display 40 drypoints and etchings from its coveted McCurdy Art Collection from 9am-2pm on Saturday, May 7. The collection includes work from artists including but not limited to Mary Cassatt, Edgar Degas, James Whistler, Charles Méryon, Francisco Goya, and Joseph Pennell.

During the annual showcase, artists, musicians, thespians, writers, etc., will present their talents at various galleries, studios, restaurants, and businesses, within and near Downtown Bloomington.

The showcase begins Friday, May 6, as part of Downtown Bloomington's monthly First Fridays activities, and will continue Saturday morning. Because the Library closes at 5pm each Friday, the McCurdy Collection will only be displayed on Saturday.

About the Nora H. McCurdy Collection

Nora McCurdy, a Bloomington socialite who traveled with relatives to Europe around the turn of the century, began collecting artwork as she traveled.

In May of 1922, her daughter, Laura McCurdy, donated her mother's collection of etchings to Withers Public Library (pre-
