by Derek Jeter

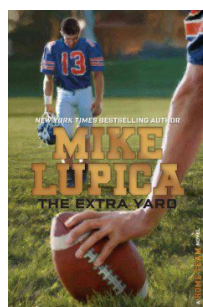

by Tim Green

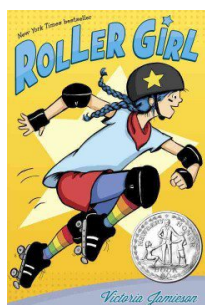
When Ryan learns that his estranged father left him the Dallas Cowboys in his will, it is all Ryan can do to keep his dad's other son from snatching the team away.

by Mike Lupica

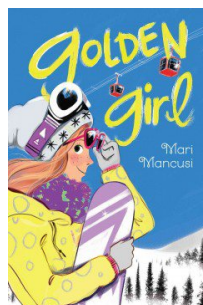
