Simply search "EBSCOhost" in the app store and download the free app. The first time you open it, the app will ask for your authorization key.

After downloading the EBSCOhost app onto your Android device or iPhone, go to the EBSCOhost home page.

- 1. On the bottom toolbar, select "iPhone and Android app"
- 2. Enter your email and select "Send"
- 3. Open the email on the device you want to use the EBSCOhost app on
- 4. Select the activation link (valid for 24 hours)
- 5. The device will authorize the app
