the end of October, I got to attend the Halloween Spooktacular where I hung out with ghosts, pirates, princesses and all sorts of other characters! The changes to the mobile app and to Zinio for Libraries web access are listed below.

Mobile App:

- The new RBdigital app for patrons will feature a newly improved navigation and home search.
- Access to the Zinio for Libraries app will end on **February 1, 2017**, and access to magazines will only be available on the RBdigital app.
- Patrons will be notified directly through their current Zinio for Libraries app to download the new RBdigital app.

Web Access:

- Zinio for Libraries (soon to be RBdigital) will keep all of the previous functionality.
- RBdigital Gateway will remain the place to access magazines and other digital services on the web until mid-2017.


