What is the information in parentheses at the end of each description?

A number followed by L is a Lexile number (example: 500L).

If you see the letters AD with a Lexile measure, that stands for "Adult Directed" and the book would be a good choice for an adult to read to or with a child.

If you see a letter by itself in parentheses, or a letter after the Lexile number, this is a Guided Reading Level (example: *Biscuit Takes a Walk* is level F).




