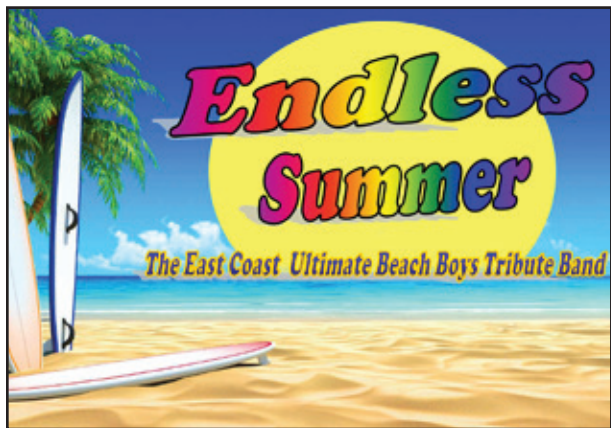

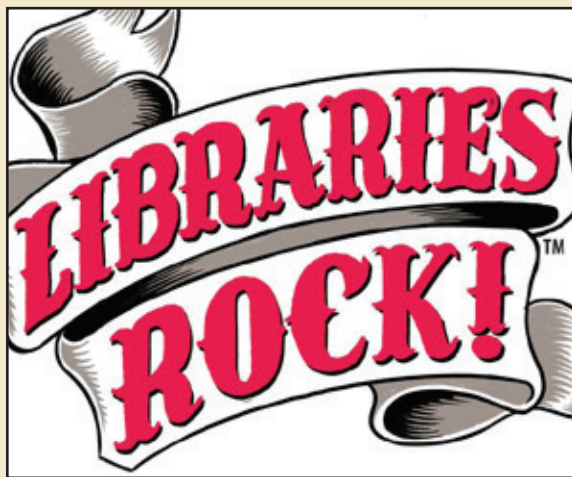

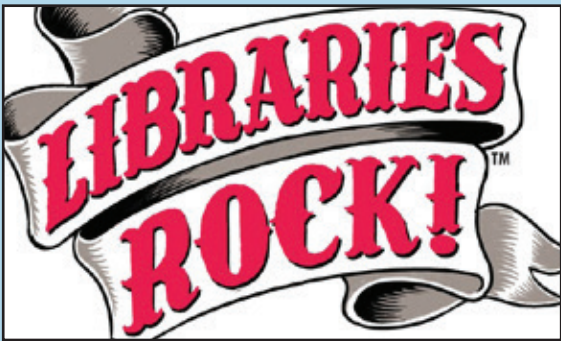
PROGRAM REGISTRATION GUIDELINES FOR ALL AGES

NO FINES

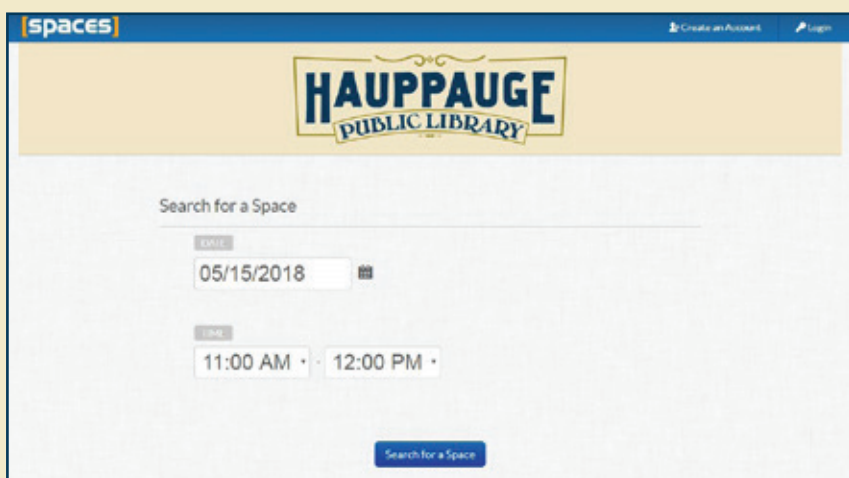
After careful deliberation, the Board of Trustees decided to change the library's overdue fine policy. There will be no overdue fees on the following materials:

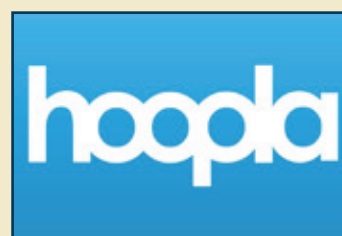
