

A love story set in the 18thcentury London of notorious thieves and queer subcultures, this genre-bending debut tells a profound story of gender, desire, and liberation.




### When Katie Met Cassidy by Camille Perri

An asexual college student despairs of ever having a relationship, when her resolve is tested by her crush on a young man.




### Southernmost by Silas House
